

SIZE: 143mm x 105mm (sheet) and 40mm x 26mm (horizontal stamp) and 26mm x 40mm (vertical stamp). Quantity: Not given. OTHER: None given, but the usual philatelic products can be expected.

CHARLES DE GAULLE

FRANCE - A single stamp depicting De Gaulle and his memorial.



Date of Issue: July 18, 2008. Designer: Elsa Catelin. Modelers and Graphics: Jacques Millet, Jean-Côme and Baptiste Coulon. **Engravers:** Elsa Catelin. **Printing:** 5-color (green, white, grey, blue and black), engraved and printed by the French State Printing works in sheets of 48 stamps. SIZE: 35mm x 26mm (stamp design) and 40mm x 30mm (the entire stamp). Quantity: Not given. OTHER: None given, but the usual philatelic products can be expected.

MARIANNE AND EUROPE

FRANCE - A booklet pane of 12 stamps, each denominated 0.55€. Stamps are of the "Marianne de l'Europe" design. The "Marianne" stamps also stand for Peace, Democracy and the Environment. Symbols of each meaning can be found se-tenant with the Marianne stamp in the booklet pane. The cover commemorates France's Presidency of the European Union, from July 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009. A second booklet and pane but with the stamps [printed in White and blue, was also issued at the same time. Specifications for the white/blue stamps and booklet are the same.





Date of Issue: June 14, 2008. Designer: Yves Beaujard (stamp) and Aurélie Baras (booklet cover). Engravers: Yves Beaujard and Claude Jumelet. Printing: White and red, engraved, by the French State Printing Works in a pane of 12 stamps. SIZE: 15mm x 22mm (stamp design) and 20mm x26mm (the entire stamp) and 130mm x 52mm (booklet cover). Quantity: given. OTHER: None given, but the usual philatelic products from La Poste can be expected. 12 Other "Marianne" stamps in different colors and values were also issued. The non-denominated "Marianne" stamps are valid for a 20 gram letter going anywhere in Europe. A 5.00€ stamp in silver was also produced.



EUROPA BRIEFS

PARAGUAY, FLAGS OF EUROPE -At figure 1 is a perforated and an imperforate souvenir sheet from Paraguay. The perforated sheet is listed in the Scott Catalogue as #835a. According to the catalogue, the sheet depicts the "flags of Europe. I also think that the sheet shows a European rocket, perhaps an early version of "Arianne." The main color of the perforated stamp is blue while the main color of the imperforate stamp is red. I've seen an imperforate sheet stamp, a partial crop of which is also at figure 1, and a stamp in blue, perforated all around. The "De La Rue..." in the selvedge of the imperforate stamp leads me to conclude that it came from a sheet or another souvenir, but it was not cut from



the imperforate souvenir sheet above.

USE OF EUROPA COMMON DESIGNS ON STAMPS OF NON-EUROPEAN COUNTRIES - Okay, while I'm doing "briefs on Paraguay, I might as well look at several other countries. Also, see page —— for an article on Paraguay and its use of Europa common designs. At figure 2 are several examples of the use of Europa designs on stamps and souvenir sheets from Yemen.

Figure 3 shows stamps from Burundi featuring Europa themes. A perforated stamp and souvenir sheet are listed in the Scott Catalogue as #139 and 140a. No mention is made of imperforate varieties. The perforated stamp shows the United "E" symbol and the 1962 symbol of the tree with 19 leaves. Following the stamp are perforated and imperforate souvenir sheets containing the same stamp. While the perforated stamp might have come from the souvenir sheet, the final illustration of an imperforate stamp indicates that they were available as sheet stamps.

CHURCHILL ON PANAMA SOU-VENIR SHEETS - Keeping on the same general theme as figures 1-3, Panama produced a set of 3 perforated stamps and a perforated souvenir sheet in 1966, Scott # 472 and 472c. The values of the stamps are 1/2c, 10c and 31c. The 10c and the 31c stamps are on two souvenir sheets. The perforated one shows two different views of Churchill and the main colors are orange (10c) and blue (31c). The imperforate souvenir sheet has the same designs but the colors are red (10c) and purple (31c). Both the 10c and 31c are airmail stamps while the 1/2c stamp is a regular issue. The 1/2c #472) and the 10c (472A) stamps were overprinted in 1968 as was the souvenir sheet (472c). The overprinted souvenir sheet comes in the perforated and imperforated varieties. The imperforate variety is in different colors.

SPORT, SOCCER - The cancel on this card commemorates the 1979 European soccer championships. The match between England and Denmark was held at Wembley Stadium on September 12, 1979. ____won the match —-.




Figure 7. Picture post card with special cancel for the 1979 England-Denmark European Soccer Championships.

SPORT, SOCCER - Another soccer related cancel can be seen on the card at figure 8. It is canceled on September 19, 1979 and it indicates that Liverpool FC won the championships and is now "back in Europe."

COUNCIL OF EUROPE, EARLY CANCEL - Sometimes, nice items turn up in otherwise inexpensive lots. Take for example the cover at figure 9. The cover bears two strikes of a Council of Europe cancel dated June 28, 1961. The cancel is a D'Urso Type II, used from November 11, 1950 to October 16, 1957. The date in the cancel is obscure preventing me from figuring out what was going on at the Council of Europe when the cancel was applied to the cover.

CEPT, 5TH ANNIVERSARY - Figure 10 shows two different examples of the same cancel. It is listed in the D'Urso Europa Catalogue as number T-144 with a rarity factor of 3. What makes this cancel of interest is the little number that appears in the corner, just above the lower leg of the letter "E." The upper cover bears the number "1" while the lower covers bear the numbers "3" & "10." Altogether, the numbers 1-15 were used.

SAINT BENEDICT, MONTE CASSINO - The item at figure 11 is a label issued for the Polish forces fighting in Italy. The label depicts Monte Cassino and the Benedictine monastery located there.

EUROPA 1961, SPAIN VARIETY - A look at the left-hand margin pair of 1961 Europa stamps at figure 12 shows a variety on the upper stamp. Look just above the letters "A" and "N" in the word "ESPAÑA." There you will see a small vertical line in white. That is the variety as can be seen by looking at the bottom

1956 EUROPA, FRANCE SET ON

CARD - The po0st card at figure 13 in the next column, shows an interesting use of France's 1956 Europa set. While it is overfranked, the card bears two strikes of the Paris first day cancel. The card is address to the Loire region of France and carries a manuscript message indicating the stamps are canceled on their first day of issue. I always enjoy seeing Europa stamps on real pieces of mail.

EUROPA 1981, GUERNSEY POSTAL CARDS - The British Post Office issues official postal cards for new issues. Those cards bear likenesses of the issued stamps. In the example of Britain's 1981 Europa stamps at figure 14, two of the postal cards, the 12p and the 18p are paired together and are unsevered. Can I assume that because they are un-severed, they are a variety?

EUROPA 1959, FRENCH CACHET -

The Council of Europe first day cancel at figure 15 caught my eye, but what really caught it was the cachet with the inscription (as translated), Europa 1959/peace and prosperity in Europe..."

EUROPA 1966, FRENCH MAXI CARD - Those of you who follow the Europa briefs know that I like to see three points of concordance on a maximum card. Those points are the stamp design, the cancel and the picture on the card. The maximum card at figure 16 is a good example. It bears one value of France's 1966 Europa stamp featuring a sail boat. The cancel and the picture on the card also depict sail boats and their designs are slightly different.

EUROPA WEEK, PASSAU 1972 -






Figure 17. special cancel for Europa Week, celebrated in May 1972 in Passau, Germany.

The card at figure 17 bears a cancel from Passau, Germany, commemorating Europa Week. The cancel is dated May 20, 1972. It is listed in the D'Urso Europa Catalogue as number F-91, and it is assigned a rarity factor of 2.

MONTECATINI (TERME) LABEL -

The label at figure 18 was sent to me by "Mike." He wants to know what it is. As can be seen on the label, it was produced for the 3rd (III) Europa (e.g., European), "Tourist stamp exhibition," held in the Italian city of Montecatini (Terme) October 14-21, 1962. Various Europa symbols appear on the sheet, Notably the "EUROPA" tower (1956 common design) and a dove made up of the flags of the European countries. Also on the sheet are the logos of the United Nations, World Refugee year and the Malaria Eradication Project. So, who can shed more light on this unofficial souvenir sheet? Especially the use of the Malaria Campaign logo?

EUROPA 1958, FRENCH COLOR PROOFS - The top three un-severed, imperforate color proofs of the 35f value of France's 1958 Europa stamps at figure 19, are in purple, red and light brown. The bottom proofs are a single in dark brown and a pair in green.

EUROPA 1961, SWISS MAXI CARD

- According to its EBay seller, the card at figure 20 was produced in a quantity of only 1500. It is a maximum card, franked with both values of Switzerland's CEPT common design set issued for Europa 1958. Note that there are three points of concordance on the maximum card - the "Dove" design on the stamps, on the card and the abbreviation "CEPT" in the cancel.

LINER EUROPA, MACHINE CAN-

CEL - The cover at figure 21 IS addressed to Germany. It was machine canceled in red, on March 19, 1930. The cancel depicts the liner Europa.

EUROPA 1957, LUXEMBOURG COVER - The registered, airmail cover at figure 22 in the next column is addressed to the United States. It is franked with 5 examples of Luxembourg's 1957 Europa set. The stamps are canceled on their first day of issue.

STAMP SHOW, JUVABA 1973 - Figure 22 provides two examples of special cancels used at the JUVABA 73 all youth international exhibition. Both cancels was used in July. Each bears a different design and a special number that might represent the day of the exhibition it was used. There is a whole set of these cancels, one for each day of the stamp show.

EUROPA 1971, ANDORRA COVER

- The airmail cover at figure 23 on the next page was mailed to the United States. It is franked in part, with two 0.50f stamps from French Andorra. In my opinion, mail from Andorra, franked with Europa stamps, is much rarer than similar cover from almost any other place issuing Europa stamps. This is a good example of commercial mail. The cover is addressed to the National Geographic Society and may have contained a reply to a dues renewal notice.

EUROPEAN STAMP DAY, 1973 -

The item at figure 24 is a card, franked at the printed matter rate, bearing two strikes of a special cancel. The cancel commemorates the celebration of "European Day of Philately." The cancel was used in the French city of Rouen. It is dated November 17-18, 1973. (Isn't that two days)?

EUROPA THEMES ON AIRGRAM -

The item at figure 25 is an airgram that depicts several Europa themes. The top picture is franked with a stamp depicting the SST. The middle picture is that of the Brandenburg Gate in Berlin. The bottom picture shows the statue to the Berlin Airlift.




Figure 26. Commercial card mailed aboard the Marshall Plan Train at its second-last stop.

MARSHALL PLAN TRAIN - The card at figure 26 was posted aboard the Marshall Plan Train during its 1951 vovage (its 2nd), through Germany. The card is canceled in Tübingen, Germany on April 13, 1951. According to a list in the D'Urso Europa Catalogue, the Marshall Plan Train was in that city from 11-13, 1951. This card was mailed aboard the train on the first day it stopped in Tübingen. The "Star" punch was applied by a conductor on the train to signify that the card actually WAS on the train. Tübingen was the second last stop on the second Germany voyage of the Marshall Plan Train. I do not understand the need for the NOTOPFER stamp, in the lower left. I thought that it was used only for mail going into or out of Berlin. This card was mailed aboard the train in Tübingen and mailed to an address in that city. Can anyone help?

COUNCIL OF EUROPE, PROOFS -

The items at figure 27 are two color proofs, in red and pale green, and an imperforate stamp in its issued colors. Does anyone know how many different trial colors exist for these stamps?

EUROPEAN UNION CONGRESS.

1961 - The card at figure 27 bears the minimum franking necessary to obtain a favor cancel. In this case, the special cancel commemorates the 12th Congress of the European Union. That congress was held in Kiel, Germany from May 26-28, 1961. The cancel on the card is dated May 26, 1961, the first day of the congress. The D'Urso Europa catalogue lists this cancel as number C-64 with an assigned rarity factor of 4.

MARSHALL PLAN, GREEK LABEL

- According to its EBay seller, the item at figure 28 is a label related to the Marshall Plan The label shows two men building (re-building) Greece following the Second World War. Can anyone shed more light on this label?

EUROPA 1974, PORTUGAL COVER

- The cover at figure 29 on the next page is interesting t me. It is a registered, airmail cover, franked with 9 Europa stamps issued in 1974 by Portugal. The cover bears three strikes of the first day cancel of April 29, 1974. There are two complete sets of the three values issued by Portugal in 1974, plus a few extra stamps of the 1.00 and 6.00 values.

JUMELAGE CONGRESS OF 1965 -

The cover at figure 30 contains two strikes of a cancel commemorating a European Jumelage (twin cities) Congress. The cancel appears to be dated June 22, 1986.

POSTAL STATIONERY, BUL-GARIA - The items below at figure 31, are pieces of postal stationery issued by Bulgaria, in 1991. While the pieces have different indicia, and different address configurations, both have the same Europa CEPT cachet.

ROCKET LABEL, BELGIUM 1961 -

The item at figure 32 is a label produced by a Belgian rocket club. The label commemorates a rocket flight that took place on May 1, 1961. The center of the label has a map of Europe and a circle of 12 stars. Both Belgium and Germany are mentioned on the label. That may have been the rocket's route. I do not know if the rocket, which carried mail, was actually flown. Does anyone know?

COUNCIL OF EUROPE DAY - The cover at figure 33 bears a Belgian cancel commemorating an exposition held on Council of Europe Day, 1958. The cancel is dated September 3, 1958. Franking is the 2f value of Belgium's 1957 Europa set. The cachet bears a representation of the United Europe flag and the 1958 common design of Europa stamps.

POSTAL MECHANIZATION FAIR -

A postal mechanization fair under the auspices the European Community, was held in Rome from October 29 through November 11, 1956. Belgium used three different cancels to commemorate the fair while Italy used 17 different cancels. The Italian cancels are listed in the D'Urso Europa Catalogue as numbers P-11 through P27. The cancels are assigned rarity factors between 4 and 8.

Three cancels, numbers P-20-22 are assigned rarity factors of 10R, the rarest of the cancels rated in the D'Urso Catalogue and its 1974 supplement. The two items at figure 34 were offered as a lot on EBay. The upper cover bears two strikes of the P-25 cancel and two strikes of what appears to be the P-16 cancel. Also seen is the P-21 cancel. The picture on the cars is of a mechanical canceling machine that was shown at the fair. That machine produced the P-22 cancel, one of the rare ones. The picture post card below bears a single strike of the P-11 cancel. The city where it was used is unreadable. This cancel was used in many Italian cities of which D'Urso records 186 different examples.




Figure 35. Panarizon Publishing Corporation card depicting General George. C. Marshall.

MARSHALL PLAN, STORY OF AMERICA CARD - The card at figure 35 on the next page is from a set of cards issued in 1979. The Card measures 4.75 x 6.25 inches and is printed on glossy cardboard stock paper. The series of cards were released by Panarizon Publishing Corporation from 1979-1980. The card back has some great facts about Marshall.




Figure 37. Truman signed letter sending thanks for supporting the Marshall Plan




Figure 38. Specimen overprint of Cyprus stamp commemorating the 50th anniversary of ???.

2007 EUROPA, CUBAN SHEETS - The sheets shown at figure 40 are Cuba's commemoration of the 50th year of Europa stamps. The sheet of four stamps comes both perforated and imperforate.

EUROPA 1964, ISLE OF MAN - The item at figure 41 is not a stamp but rather a carriage label. It can carry mail on the Isle of Man but in addition, the correct postage rate in real stamps has to be affixed to an item before it can be carried in the mail away from the Isle of Man. In any event, the label does commemorate Europa 1964 and a map of Europe is depicted on the label.




Figure 43. German cancel commemorating the 35th anniversary of the Council of Europe.

GERMAN-FRENCH COOPERA- TION - The German cover at figure 44 commemorates 45 years of cooperation between Germany and France. The cancel is from Kiel, Germany and it is dated January 16, 2003. The cancel depicts Konrad Adenauer and Charles DeGaulle.

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT, DIREST ELECTIONS - The block of four labels at figure 45 was issued to commemorate the 1979 (first) direst elections the European Parliament. The label has been seen before in the pages of the Europa News. However, it is shown again here to point out that they are much more costly than previously though. The EBay seller of this block asked \$300 as an opening bid.

SPORT, GYMNASTICS - The Yugo-slavian stamp and cancel at figure 46, commemorate the 5th European Cup in Gymnastics, held in that country in 1963. On July 6, 1963, Yugoslavia issued a set of three stamps showing different gymnastics events. The cancel is D'Urso number U-198 with a rarity factor of 5.

SPORT - SOCCER, 1992 ALBANIA -

The imperforate stamp at figure 47 is from a set of four stamps. It was issued by Albania on June 10, 1992 to commemorate that year's European Soccer Championships to be held in Sweden 10-26 "Gershor?" 1992.

MARSHALL PLAN, ERP CANCEL -

The cancel at figure 48 in the next column is one of 103 different cancels listed in the D'Urso Europa Catalogue. Note that the circular date stamp proceeds the slogan. Another 68 cancels are listed in D'Urso where the slogan proceeds the circular date stamp. Both types are listed as number G12. The specific cancel illustrated here comes from Naples

(Ferr.(ovia) corrispondenze). It is dated November 4, 1950. The cancel is listed in the D'Urso Catalogue as number G12/60 with a rarity factor of 3. The D'Urso listing indicates that the cancel was used in 1950 and 1951.

MONNET, JEAN. MAXI CARD - The French maximum card at figure 49 is franked with a pair of France's 1976 Jean Monnet stamps. The maximum card has three points of concordance: The picture; the stamp (on which Monnet is depicted differently than on the card); and, the cancel which has a bust of Monnet in its design.

COUNCI OF EUROPE, IMPROPER USE OF OFFICIAL STAMP - The

1987 cover at figure 50 in the next column shows an improper use of an official Council of Europe stamp. These stamps are only supposed to be used at the post office located in the Council of Europe Headquarters building in Strasbourg, or at the Strasbourg central post office when the Council of Europe post office is closed. The stamp should have not been used in France proper, as shown in the figure, from Givet.

SCHUMAN, ROBERT, FRENCH STAMP AND COLOR PROOF - The philatelic item at figure 51 looks to me to be a 1975 French stamp (on the left) with an official first day cancel. The item on the right appears to e to be a color proof, in brown, that was added to the piece.

FRENCH 5TH ANNIVERSARY OF EUROPA SOUVENIR SHEETS

This article was prompted by member Louis G. Charest of Woonsocket, Rhode Island. In a letter to Don Smith, Louis wrote about an item that appeared in the *Europa News*, issue #386. The item is shown here. It was described in #386-14 as a Souvenir card commemorating the 5th anniversary of Europa stamps.

Mr. Charest wrote that "the card, shown here and 12 more cards complete a set of 13 cards honoring the Europa 5th anniversary." He went on to write that he has a list of them (the cards)., which are

listed by Paul Staedel in his 1976-7 catalogue edit." Mr. Charest provided his list which forms the basis of the table shown here. He also wanted to know if the cards are listed in the Michel Catalogue. I looked up the listing for France 1961 in my Michel catalogue and did not find a reference to the cards.

Don Smith wrote back to Mr. Charest and provided the following additional information. "...the D'Urso Catalogue also lists the souvenir sheets. You will also note that the order is a bit different than the Staedel order...and D'Urso mentions that the first issues with the Paris and Council of Europe cancels were also applied to buff-color paper as well as on gummed paper." Don went on to write that (using the D'Urso list) there is one more sheet, not listed by Staedel, (e.g., Staedel number EB1 on buff paper)." What follows are two tables. Table 1 is the information from the Staedel Catalogue, as provided by Mr. Charest. Table 2 is a comparative listing of the souvenir sheets as listed in the D'Urso Catalogue. Scans of the two other souvenir sheet designs are shown below.

PARAGUAY STAMPS WITH EUROPA COMMON DESIGNS

It is a long-standing policy of the Europa Study Unit, not to tell our members what or how to collect Europa philately. This article is devoted to what I believe is philately that trades on the Europa theme and logo for the purpose of getting collectors to purchase the items. Here is an example of what I mean.

PARAGUAY 1961 - First there was a set of 7 stamps. Five of the stamps used the 1958 Europa common design of a dove flying over the letter "E," while the \$20 and \$50 stamps, both airmails, used the 1961 Europa common design of 19 doves flying as one dove. This set is listed in the Scott Catalogue as #623-629.



Scott lists a souvenir sheet of 5 stamps as #627a (50c through 4.50g). It is shown below. In the selvedge of the sheet are words that translate as "Republic of Paraguay homage to the European Community." A label of the 1958 Europa common design of a dove flying over the letter "E" is also on the sheet which is perforated all around through its selvedge.



Scott also lists another souvenir sheet of 1 stamp. It is number 629a and depicts the \$50 value. The two souvenir sheets and the two airmail stamps are not valued in the Scott Catalogue.



Scott makes no mention of the \$50 stamp on an imperforate souvenir sheet. The main color of the stamp on this sheet is blue while the main color of the \$50 stamp as an individual stamp and on the perforated souvenir sheet is green.

The 1958 design stamps are also on an



imperforate souvenir sheet bearing the same inscription as previously mentioned.

There is also an imperforate set of all 7 stamps. The 5 stamps with the 1958



Europa common design are in the same colors as the sheet above. This leads me to conclude that they likely were cut from the imperforate souvenir sheet. The \$50 imperforate stamp likely was cut from the souvenir sheet shown above.

However, the main color of the \$20 stamp is orange on the imperforate stamp and pink on the perforated form. This leads me to conclude that there is yet another sheet of imperforate stamps or at least another souvenir sheet that I have not seen.



In 1962 it started again. Shown here is a set of 2 stamps using the 1962 Europa common design of a tree bearing 19 leaves. Scott lists these stamps as #726-727. The main colors of the stamps are yellow of the \$4 value and green on the G36 value. The \$36 stamp is an airmail.



No mention is made of imperforate stamps.



However, Scott does list a souvenir sheet of 2 stamp as #727a. The colors of the stamps on the souvenir sheet are identical to the imperforate stamps above leading me to conclude that they might have been cut from the souvenir sheet. I also wonder if there is a perforated souvenir sheet of the two stamps.



SHEETS OF STAMPS ISSUED BY THE "CROATIAN GOVERNMENT

IN EXILE - A group of entrepreneurs began issuing sheets of 10 "stamps" in the name of the Croatian Government in Exile. Of course these items are neither stamps nor philatelic. Rather they are labels. However, they are of some interest to Europa collectors because the labels use representations of Europa CEPT common designs. Following are sheets of these labels "issued" between 1966 and 1972, and shown in year order.
